Recipe of the Month Recipe of the Month Slow cooked Riblets Spray 3 ½ or 4 quart slow cooker with nonstick cooking spray. Place a 3 lb rack of pork back ribs (cut lengthwise in half across bones and cutting into 1 rib pieces) and 3 cloves garlic minced in sprayed slow cooker. Cover cook on low setting for 6 to 7 hours. About 35 minutes before serving, in 2-cup measuring cup or small bowl combine 1 cup ketchup, ¼ cup firmly packed brown sugar, ¼ cup chopped chipotle chiles in adobo sauce, 1 tablespoon cider vinegar, 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce, 1 teaspoon salt. Mix well. Drain and discard juices from slow cooker. Pour or spoon sauce over riblets, stir gently to coat evenly. Increase heat setting to high; cover and cook 25 to 30 minutes or until riblets are glazed.
